Harmonic Singing, also known as overtone singing or throat singing, involves singing and listening with attention to the voice's natural harmonics, creating a unique and captivating sound. This technique was once relatively unknown but has gained recognition through the chanting of Tibetan monks, Tuvan throat singers, and the music of David Hykes and the Harmonic Choir. Timothy Hill, as a member of the Harmonic Choir, helped establish harmonic singing as an art form. He appears on several of their recordings and has performed extensively worldwide. Hill believes that harmonic singing provides insights into harmony and language origins. He has conducted workshops and lectured at prestigious institutions, including NYU, Dartmouth College, and the Bard College Conservatory Graduate Vocal Program.
